

Miss Marion Hollins Wins Women's Golf Championship

DEAL, N. J., Oct. 8.—Miss Marion Hollins, New York, won the American woman's golf championship here this afternoon when she defeated Miss Alexa Stirling, Atlanta, former champion, five up and four to go, in the final round of the National championship tournament.

The former title holder went miserably all day. She rallied up to her game late in the morning round and early in the afternoon play. The new champion played a steady game and she seemed to get all the breaks in luck.

The new champion, in addition to playing golf, is a star tennis player and an accomplished horsewoman, being prominent in society. She won the qualifying round in Cleveland last year and was the last American survivor this year in the British championships. She is a sister of Harry B.
